



PROJECT BENEFITS

Considering our surroundings

From early design stage and during the life of the project, we have been considerate of the community we are working in. This includes the environment, and below highlights some of the elements.

- **Sustainability:** The Alliance developed a sustainable design which removed the need to build a temporary rail track in the Park Lands. This reduced the impact of the project on the Park Lands in both temporary and permanent designs. Tree removal was reduced which left the habitat corridors in the Park Lands.
- **Tree replacement and offset planting:** There were significant efforts to reduce the removal of vegetation especially significant and regulated trees where possible. In the Adelaide Park Lands the replanting of significant trees has a rate of 3:1, regulated trees 2:1 and amenity trees 1:1.
- **Landscaping:** The landscaping design for the project has been developed in consultation with the City of Charles Sturt and the City of Adelaide. In areas where local indigenous planting has been impacted the Alliance has been working with the local council to ensure the area is restored appropriately to not introduce new species.

Landscaping and re-planting of trees and plants in the Park Lands and Bowden commenced in April.

Pedestrian and cyclist connectivity

New connections via shared use paths and pedestrian / cyclist bridges are now open. Cyclists and pedestrians can now ride from Drayton Street to the Park Lands, passing under Park Terrace.

The Mike Turtur bikeway overpass is in the planning phase.

WORKING WITH THE COMMUNITY

Project's huge OzHarvest fundraiser



End of December OzHarvest joined us at our Bowden site office. In support of what they do, the project team had been fundraising all year long by recycling their bottles and cans.

At completion of the project, we managed to collect a massive **61,111** cans and bottles. Not only has this provided much needed funds for OzHarvest, but it has saved tens of thousands of containers from going to landfill. Win/win! Supporting our recycling programme benefiting OzHarvest, team members and companies donated as well. We have been thrilled to donate a total of **\$16,271** which means OzHarvest will be able to rescue and deliver a further **32,542** meals for people in need across Adelaide.

Supporting the Roma Mitchell Garden

Since the start of the project, we have been working with the Roma Mitchell Garden (Adelaide Care Centre). The Garden is located next to the Adelaide Goal and adjacent to the rail corridor, and produces fruit and vegetables, while chickens and goats provide eggs and milk. We have been able to witness the joy they are spreading in helping people in need by providing food, a roof and some enjoyment of gardening. It is a very special organisation.
